IMPLEMENTATION EXAMPLES

Example 1 - Assemble a Planning Team

Most plans have a list of participants on the planning team with their role or department. When engaging local government staff and community stakeholders, it may be helpful to explore some of these lists.

- The <u>City of Charleston All Hazards Vulnerability and Risk Assessment</u> has a complete list of the project team at the beginning of the report.
- An advisory committee was created for the <u>City of Baltimore Disaster Preparedness and Planning Project (2018)</u>, which is detailed in Table 1 (Chapter 1).

Engaging community members is an important part of forming the planning team. The <u>City of Austin</u> developed a Community Climate Ambassador Program.

Example 2 - Plan for Community Participation

- Throughout the planning process, the <u>City of Austin</u> had nearly 200 Austin residents participate. A steering committee provided direction and accountability and five advisory groups helped craft goals and strategies informed by input from a Community Climate Ambassadors Program.
- The City of Tallahassee developed the <u>Community Resilience Plan</u> with extensive stakeholder engagement and community outreach. This consisted of targeted meetings and workshops through community events, neighborhood meetings, and nonprofit roundtables.
